



- 1 Sir Vivian Fuchs Garden.** The former home of the famous Antarctic explorer. Here you will find themed plants with names associated with snow and ice, and many white-flowered shrubs. Note the large border with a centrepiece of *Dicksonia antarctica* (tree fern).
- 2 Western Field.** Here you will find Italian cypresses with mixed shrubs and herbaceous plants for all-year interest, along with the familiar sight of roses and fuchsias.
- 3 West Court.** Have a seat within the silver birch glade and enjoy watching how the breeze plays with *Miscanthus* and *Hakonechloa* grasses in the mixed grass border.
- 4 East Court.** Under the Holm oak are shade-loving plants like hostas and heucherellas.
- 5 Sundial Garden.** Enjoy borders that have year-round colour and form. Note the banana plants and *Canna* 'Cleopatra' with its dazzling dark veins on green foliage.
- 6 Exotic Garden.** Find yourself surrounded by dramatic salvias, bamboos and a monkey puzzle tree.
- 7 Barton Garden.** A lovely relaxed spot with beautiful herbaceous borders and a student-tended garden full of delicious produce.
- 8 Betty Wu Lee Garden.** This Chinese-inspired garden is home to graceful *Acer* 'Sango-kaku' and Henry the horse — just one of a number of sculptures located in the College grounds.
- 9 Winter Garden.** A tucked-away masterpiece created by Head Gardener Phil Stigwood. Here *Acer* 'Phoenix' shines dazzling bright in the winter sky along with many coloured stems and fragrant winter-flowering shrubs. Enjoy now but be sure to come back on a crisp winter day.
