

Wolfson College: Orientation for New Undergraduates

Welcome to Wolfson! We hope that you will be able to attend all these events to help you prepare for your time at Wolfson College. Please note that some are mandatory. All events have been planned to ensure that they follow the College's Covid-secure policy. A few explanatory notes:

- This programme lists only those events intended exclusively for new undergraduates. It should be read together with the more comprehensive Wolfson College Freshers' Week Programme.
- On Friday, please bring a device with access to the internet (a phone is fine) or a pen and paper if you don't have one. You may wish to bring a bottle of water and some warm layers of clothing as the rooms for the in-person sessions will be well-ventilated.
- All in-person sessions will be conducted with a social distance of 2 metres between participants; please also bring a face covering and wear it if you wish or if a member of your break-out group requests it.
- All Friday sessions are offered as both 'in-person' and online'; the Saturday sessions are all on-line.
- Please observe the divisions into Groups for the Friday and Saturday sessions. These are organised by mixing and mingling sub-groups of students so that you will have the opportunity to meet a wide range of your peers, rather than spending all the sessions with the same group of 15 or 20. With the exception of Group C which is open to all students who prefer on-line instruction, each 'letter' Group (A, B, D, etc) is composed of two smaller sub-groups, organised by surname, and listed by number below:
